RESEARCH INTERESTS

My research area is sport for development and has two distinct aims. First, I examine how sport is used as a resource to overcome difficult transitions across their life and how this impacts holistic development. I examine sport participation on various transition points across the life-course to help explain, predict, and evaluate sport's efficacy as a developmental tool that can influence people's quality of life. Second, I investigate how sport business organizations may grow and develop, seeking strategic uses of sport programs and their delivery. The expected results will illuminate innovative ways to strategically meet both short-term and long-term objectives using sport as that vehicle. Both aims are used to inform my class curriculum and build strategic relationships for enhancing teaching and future employment for my students' sport industry aspirations.
